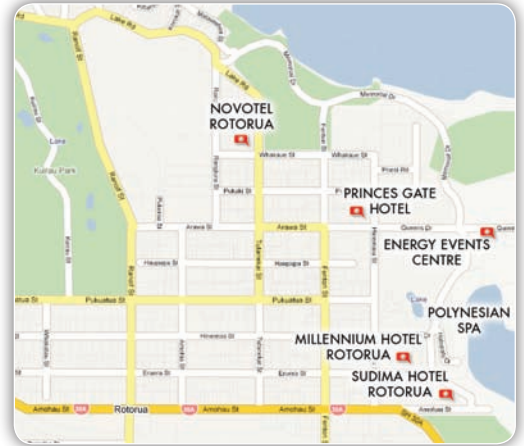

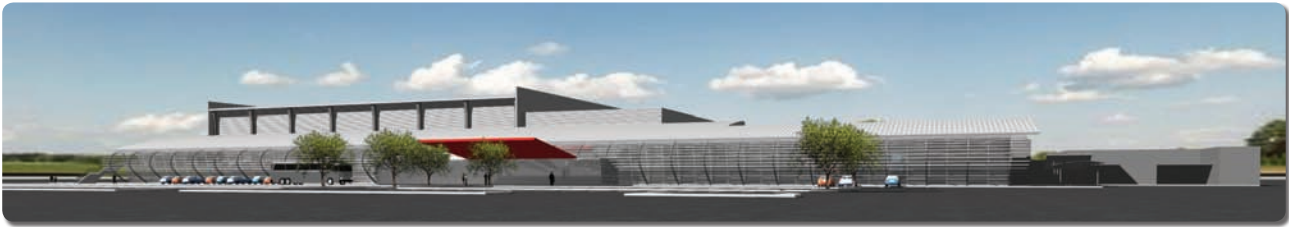

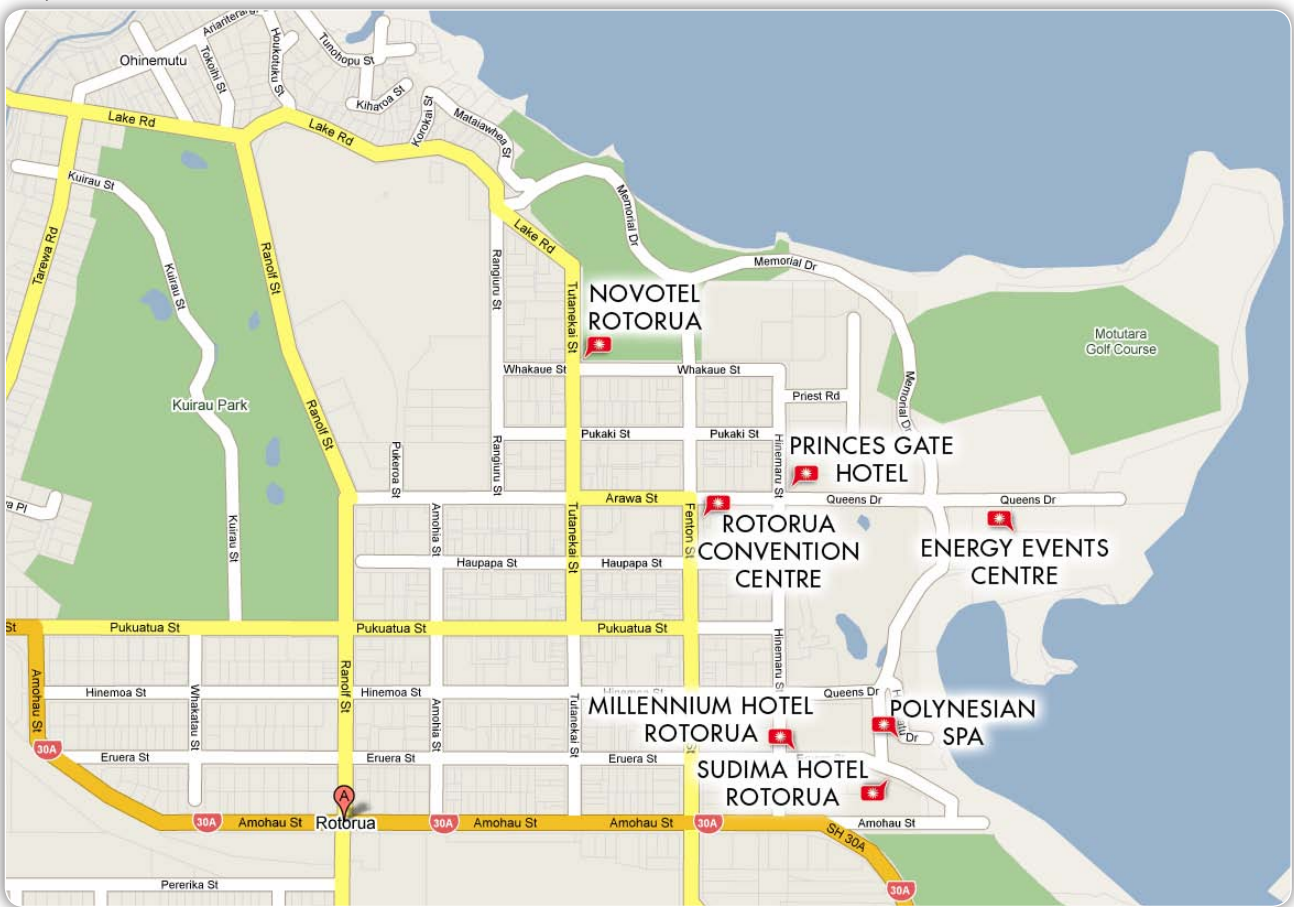

Map of Rotorua



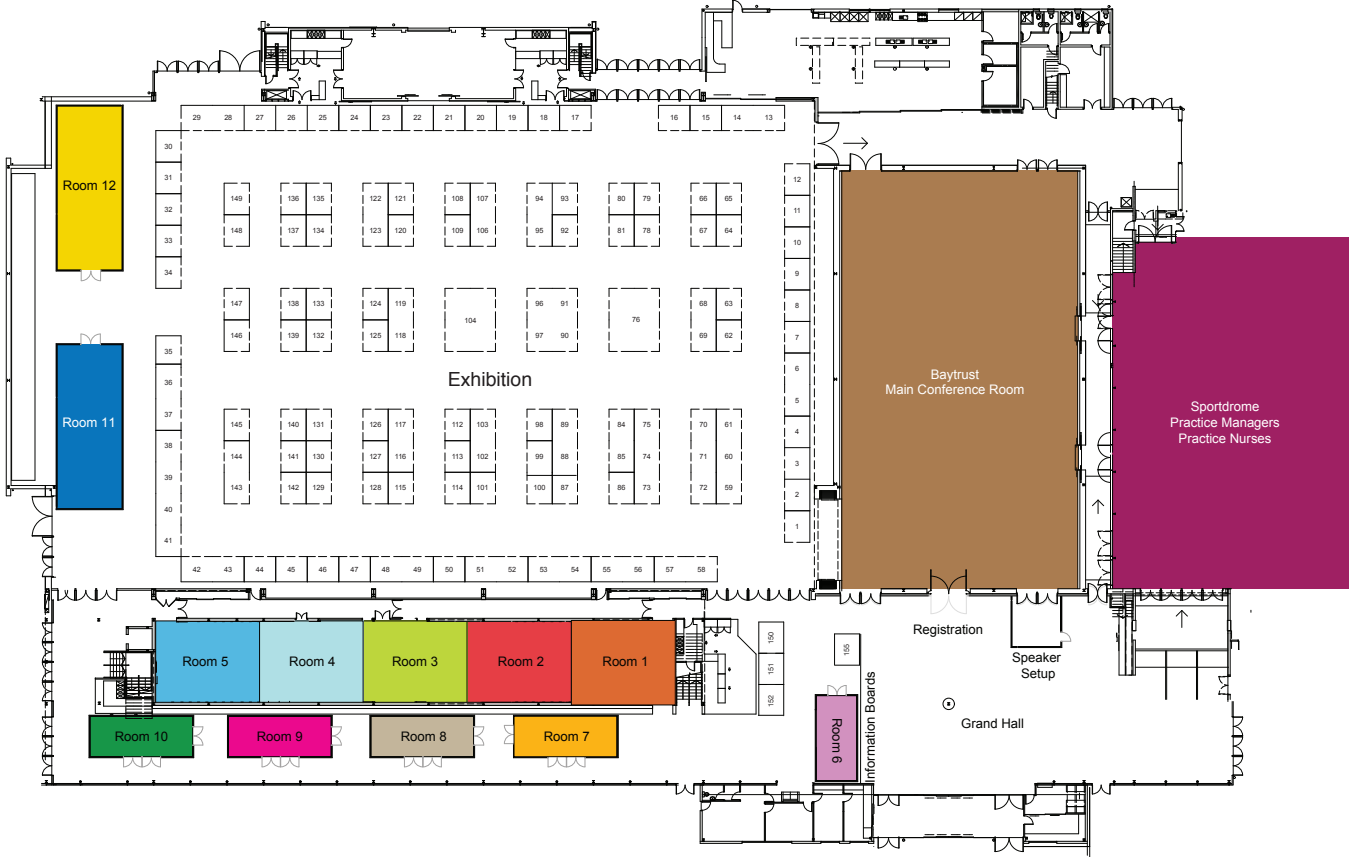
